Tools Needed		Having your boat detailed whether doing it yourself or having it done professionally, requires certain tools and the proper space to use them.

Detailed Steps		Keeping your boat in top shape is important not only to protect its value but also to ensure many years of fun times on the water.	
Rinse the boat	Remove grime and loose debris from the surface of your vessel. Start at the top of your boat and work down.		
Soap + Cleanser	Using a specialized boat cleaner, work from top to bottom to fully remove the grime and dirt. Do not let the soap dry as this can damage your boat's finish. Clean small sections at a time and rinse off as you go.		
Waxing	Apply wax evenly. Work in small sections and remove the wax after a short time to allow for drying.		
Interior Detailing	Use a cleaner that is mild enough for your interior materials, but strong enough to remove dirt. Polish all stainless steel and chrome. Scrub seats to remove any stains.		
Finishing	Apply protectants to areas of the boat that will be exposed to the sun.
